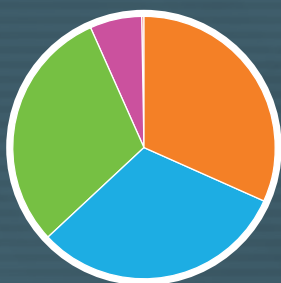

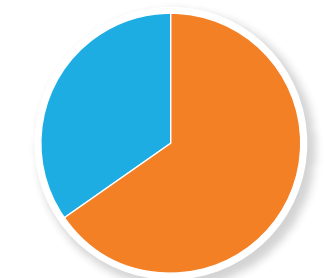

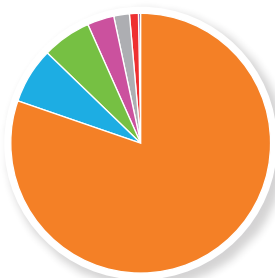
## GENDER\*

Female .....34.5%

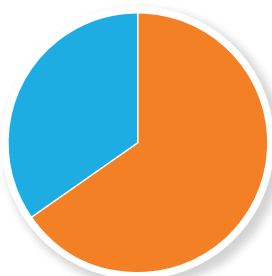

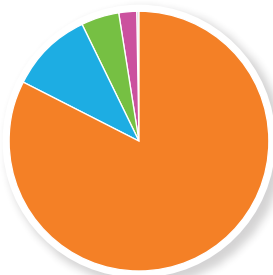
