Building Better Lives in Recovery

The Halfway House Program - has seen significant changes this year. We hired our first full-time clinical director, administrative/HR assistant, case manager and additional technician staff positions. This program is staffed with licensed alcohol and drug counselors, licensed mental health practitioners, case manager and technicians. While in services, for 6 to 9 months, clients address substance use and mental health issues, build life skills, find employment and prepare for independent living.

Touchstone, a 20-bed short-term residential substance use treatment program, serves adult men and women. Touchstone is staffed with licensed alcohol and drug counselors, licensed mental health practitioners, nurse, case manager and technicians. While in this

30-45 day treatment program, clients address mental health and substance use, trauma and physical health needs. Touchstone serves approximately 200 individuals a year and staff work closely with family and outside providers to ensure that everyone receives maximum benefits from the program.

Touchstone is a collaboration between Houses of Hope and CenterPointe.



TASC (Targeted Adult Service Coordination) is made up of Intensive Community Services, Emergency, Recovery Support and Crisis Response – which provide community-based services in the client's home environment. TASC works with individuals

and their support system to implement service goals that help improve guality of life. TASC is staffed weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and on-call overnights, weekends and holidays.

TASC is a collaboration between Houses of Hope, Blue Valley Behavioral Health, Lutheran Family Services and The Bridge Behavioral Health.






RACE / ETHNICITY
